MUG RAFFLE

Buy an ACSCI Mug for \$30. Each mug contains Table Raffle Tickets ranging in value from \$40 up to \$70. No mug contains LESS than 4 tickets or \$40 worth of Table Raffle Tickets. Use these tickets for entry in any of the five Table Raffles: Big Bore, Predator, Sables, Whitetail and Young Hunter Table Raffles. You can also purchase a ticket pack (14@\$100) at this location.

50/50 RAFFLE

Tickets are \$5 each; 3 for \$10; 10 for \$20. Tickets on sale at 1pm and are sold until the drawing in late afternoon.

BINGO GAME, NO LOSERS!

Buy 1 Bingo Card for \$20, 3 Cards for \$50, or 10 Cards for \$100. Prize is either the gun or \$599. This is a Bingo Game but one in which you DO NOT want the number that is being called to appear on your card. If the number called is on your card, you will turn in that card for \$20 worth of tickets (2) for entry in the Table Raffles and that card is no longer in the game. But as long as the numbers being called DO NOT appear on a bingo card you are holding, you are still in the game. The last person with no called number on their card is the Bingo Winner!!

CHAPTER GUN OF THE YEAR RAFFLE

Tickets are \$50 each and only 100 tickets will be sold for this raffle. Ticket Purchaser need not be present to win.

4-GUN GAME

To play this game, enter four player names on the entry form and collect \$20 from each player (4x\$20=\$80). Place completed entry form with \$80 in the 4-Gun Game envelope available on the 4-Gun display table. DO NOT SEAL THE ENVELOPE. If a volunteer is not at the 4-Gun table, bring the envelope to the Registration/Check-In table. We'll check that your entry is completed before sealing the envelope and adding it to entry bucket. Each player named on the entry form must complete and pass a National Instant Background Check (NICS) before taking possession of a firearm. The prize for this game is 4-Guns.

MYSTERY GUN RAFFLE

Tickets sell 3 for \$20 or an arm's length of tickets for \$30. Drawing for the gun is at the end of the evening.

SPIRITS OF THE HUNT

Basket with a selection of wines, liquors, and distilled beverages. Tickets sell 3 for \$20, or an arm's length of tickets for \$30. Drawing is in the evening.

UN-STICK THE PIG RAFFLE

The game starts with a pig target 'stuck' with 100 knives. To play the game, it's \$25 per knife pull to 'un-stick' the pig. You get one entry or ticket in the drawing for a gun per knife pull and you get to keep the knife. Drawing for the gun prize occurs when all 100 knives are pulled from the pig.

YOUTH SAFARI WISH RAFFLE

Proceeds from this game go towards funding the ACSCI Youth Safari Wish program. Each ticket sells for \$20 with a maximum of 100 tickets being sold. Drawing for the gun occurs when tickets are sold or at the end of the evening.

Cards begin selling at 1pm with decks being sold throughout the day. Each card in a deck of cards will sell for \$25. You get half a card with the other half going in the bucket. Drawing for a gun occurs when all cards in that deck are sold. If your half-card matches the one drawn, you get to choose one gun from the Wall of Guns. Then the next deck of cards will begin selling to start a new game. If all cards in a deck are not sold, half of the proceeds collected for that part of the deck will be awarded in cash and the game ends.






